REQUEST FOR STAKEHOLDER INPUT ON REGULATION REVISIONS AFFECTING GAS STATIONS

NOTICE IS HEREBY given that Northwest Clean Air Agency (NWCAA) is requesting preliminary input from stakeholders on proposed revisions to gasoline dispensing facility (GDF) requirements.

Highlights of Draft Requirements

Conduct periodic static pressure decay tests on the following frequency:

- | <u>Gallons gasoline dispensed</u> | <u>Testing frequency</u> |
|-----------------------------------|--------------------------|
| a. 30,000-119,999 gal/yr | Every 5 years |
| b. 120,000-1,200,000 gal/yr | Every 3 years |
| c. >1,200,000 gal/yr | Every year |
- Note: Some gasoline dispensing facilities are already conducting static pressure decay tests that meet the testing frequencies listed above.*
- If applicable, repair defective equipment within 48 hours or shut down the defective equipment until repaired and retested.
 - Submit test reports to NWCAA within 30 days of testing.
 - Keep a copy of test reports for 5 years.
