DRAFT AIR OPERATING PERMIT

NOTICE IS HEREBY given that the Northwest Clean Air Agency (NWCAA) will take action on and seeks comments on a draft Air Operating Permit (AOP) renewal for the following facility:

**Northwest Pipeline LLC – Sumas Compressor Station
4738 Jones Road
Sumas, WA 98295-9405**

Northwest Pipeline LLC (NWP) owns and operates the Sumas Compressor Station (NWP-SCS). NWP-SCS is comprised of four Ingersoll-Rand 412KVS reciprocating engines, two Clark TCV-12 reciprocating engines, and three Solar Mars 90S turbines that are all used to compress and distribute natural gas from the Washington-Canada border near Sumas through their pipeline system. The natural gas pipeline system serves commercial, industrial, utility, and cogeneration customers in Washington, Oregon, Nevada, and California.

In addition to the compression units, NWP-SCS operates three Sellers water heater/boilers and three emergency electrical generators.

NWP-SCS must obtain an air operating permit (AOP) under Title 40 Code of Federal Regulations Part 70 (40 CFR 70) because the facility emits more than 100 tons per year (TPY) of the criteria pollutants CO, NO_x, more than 10 TPY of formaldehyde, a Hazardous Air Pollutant (HAP), and more than 25 TPY of combined HAPs. The facility also has the potential to emit more than 100,000 tons of CO_{2e} and more than 100 tons of greenhouse gases on a mass basis per year. NWP-SCS must obtain an AOP

The AOP compiles existing air quality requirements and permits into one comprehensive document and establishes monitoring, recordkeeping and reporting procedures to assure compliance. The AOP does not approve emission increases or require emission decreases. The AOP must be renewed every 5 years. This action is a renewal of the existing AOP. NWCAA may hold a public hearing if the agency determines that there is significant public interest. Requests for a public hearing must be submitted within the comment period. Any such requests must indicate the interest of the person or organization filing the request, and describe why a public hearing is necessary.

NWCAA is publishing this notice pursuant to the Washington State Clean Air Act (RCW 70.94). The AOP is issued pursuant to Chapter 173-401 WAC and Title V of the federal Clean Air Act Amendments of 1990.
