Notes:

All annual emissions referenced here exclude carbon monoxide and greenhouse gases and are rounded to the nearest one-tenth of a ton.

Actual annual emissions and gallons of gasoline pumped are determined for the preceding calendar year (e.g., 2018 fees are calculated using 2016 actual emissions or gasoline throughput).

Failure to provide actual annual emissions/usages or throughput information may result in the agency using potential-to-emit (emissions resulting from operations 24 hours per day, 365 days per year) to calculate fees.

This fee schedule is adjusted annually as described in Resolution 558.

Attachment 1: Complex 1 and 2 Listing

Multiple fees within a complexity may apply; for example, the complexity fee for a portable rock crusher subject to 60 Subpart OOO powered by a 450 hp diesel generator is subject to the Complex 1 fee multiplied by 3. Descriptions within the complexity listings apply on a facility basis unless specified otherwise.

Complex 1

- Composite (fiberglass) fabrication and surface coating operations utilizing rolling average/weighted average limits to meet compliance (excludes synthetic minors).
- 5 to 20 nuisance complaints¹/year
- Portable/temporary source
- Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) Title 40:
 - 60 Subpart Ja – Petroleum Refinery Operations
 - 60 Subpart Kb – Petroleum Storage Tanks – *per tank*
 - 60 Subpart UU – Asphalt Processing and Roofing Manufacturing
 - 60 Subpart OOO – Rock Crushing
 - 63 Subpart M - Perchloroethylene dry cleaners
 - 63 Subpart N – Chromium Electroplating
 - 63 Subpart 4Z (small) – RICE Engines (greater than 300 hp, and less than or equal to 500 hp non-emergency, non-limited use) – *per engine, for first three*
 - 63 Subpart 6B – Bulk Gasoline Terminal
 - 63 Subpart 6J (small) – Boilers (less than 10 MMBtu/hr other than natural gas-fired) – *per boiler, for first three*
 - 63 Subpart 6Q – Wood Preservation
 - 63 Subpart 6W – Metal Plating and Polishing

Complex 2

- More than 3 Orders (e.g., Order of Approval to Construct (OAC), General Order, Regulatory Orders such as a Synthetic Minor Order, etc.)
- More than 20 nuisance complaints¹/year
- Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) Title 40:
 - 60 Subpart Dc – Boilers (greater than or equal to 30 MMBtu/hr wood-fired) – *per boiler, for first three*
 - 63 Subpart 4Z (large) – RICE engines (greater than 500 hp non-emergency, non-limited use) – *per engine, for first three*
 - 63 Subpart 5Z – Iron and steel foundries
 - 63 Subpart 6J (large) – Boilers (greater than or equal to 10 MMBtu/hr other than natural gas-fired) – *per boiler, for first three*
 - 63 Subpart 7A – Asphalt Processing and Roofing Manufacture
 - 63 Subpart 7D – Animal feed

¹ NWCAA staff will determine malicious and/or unsubstantiated complaints for exclusion from billing. In general, NWCAA will consider impacts to separate households and/or separate incidents in these complaint counts.
