NWCAA calls off air quality burn ban in Whatcom, Skagit, Island counties as wildfire smoke clears

But the counties continue fire safety bans to limit danger

At 12:01 a.m. Tuesday (8/22), the <u>Northwest Clean Air Agency</u> will end a Stage 2 air quality burn ban for Whatcom, Skagit, and Island because air quality has improved as shifting winds clear out wildfire smoke.

NOTE: NWCAA's air quality burn ban was separate from the three counties' fire safety burn bans on outdoor burning, which remain in effect because of increased fire danger.

Those Stage 2 bans limit outdoor burning in rural areas, including recreational fires like campfires. Also, some cities have called similar bans due to dry conditions.

Please remember that the counties' fire safety burn bans are still in place until local fire officials determine that fire danger has passed.

The air quality burn ban is being lifted because levels of fine particles from wildfire smoke are dropping throughout the region due to changing weather conditions.
